KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

having deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE a WARRANT in his favor, numbered

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto

Nathaniel W. Tobey,
assignee of said George W. Vander-
ver, The North half of the North East Quarter of Sect-
ion eleven, and the West half of the North West Quarter
of section twelve, in Township thirty seven, North, of
range nineteen West, in the District of Lands subject
to sale at Clinton Missouri, containing one hundred
and sixty acres

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by
the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tract have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned War-
rant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND
TO HOLD the said parts of said sections of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

Nathaniel W. Tobey
and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
